An overview of PSHE in Year 3 – Spring Term 2

Our learning this term in PSHE will be about "Britain"

Below you can read the overview of learning for this PSHE topic.

• Living in Britain

Children will discuss what it is like to live in Britain and explore the range of identities in the United Kingdom, and the benefits of living in a multicultural society.

Democracy

Children will learn what democracy is, and understand that there are basic human rights shared by all people and that children have their own special rights set out in the United Nations Declarations of Rights of the Child. They will discuss what democracy is and learn about the basic institutions that support it.

• Rules, Laws and Responsibilities

The children will learn the difference between rules and laws, how and why rules and laws that protect themselves and others are made and enforced and understand why different rules and laws are needed in different situations.

Liberty

Children will discuss the meaning of liberty, and understand that there are basic human rights shared by all peoples and all societies. They will learn that these universal rights are there to protect everyone.

Tolerance and respect

Children will discuss diversity and its meaning. They will learn that there are differences and similarities between people and that these arise from a number of reasons. They will learn to appreciate the range of nationals, regional, religious and ethnic identities in the United Kingdom

What does it mean to be British?

Children will research, discuss and debate topical issues, problems and events. They will consider the lives of people living in other places, and people with different values and customs.
