

Year 4 PSHE Spring 2

Wider World – One World

This unit is based on a case study of a fictional girl called Chiwa, who lives in Malawi. The children will explore different aspects of her life in each lesson. It is inspired by the idea that people's life experiences and opportunities differ throughout the world and that our actions can have both positive and harmful effects on people living in different countries. It aims to enable the children to explore the concepts of inequality and stereotypes and encourages them to reflect on what they can do to help make the world a fairer place. In this unit, children also learn about climate change and its effects, fair trading practices and organisations, which help people like Chiwa. They will also learn about how to be a good global citizen.

Chiwa and Kwende The children will consider the lives of people living in other places and people with different values and customs. They will learn that differences and similarities between people arise from a number of factors, including family, cultural, ethnic, racial and religious diversity, age, gender and disability and discuss ways in which people's lives are similar and different.	Chiwa's Dilemma (1) The children will learn to recognise and challenge stereotypes. They will learn that there are basic human rights shared by all people and all societies and that children have their own special rights set out in the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of the Child.	Chiwa's Dilemma (2) The children will research, discuss and debate topical issues, problems and events that are of concern to them and offer their recommendations. They will think about the lives of people living in other places, make considered decisions and give reasons for their opinions.	Chiwa's Sugar The children will learn that resources can be allocated in different ways and that these economic choices affect individuals, communities and the sustainability of the environment across the world. They will learn how their actions impact on people living in different countries and identify things they can do to make the world a fairer place.	Chiwa's World Children will learn that they have different kinds of responsibilities, rights and duties at home, at school, in the community and towards the environment; they will continue to develop the skills to practise these responsibilities across the world. They will learn about what climate change is and how it affects people's lives and identify what they can do to help.	Charity for Chiwa Children will learn about the role of voluntary, community and pressure groups, especially in relation to health and wellbeing. They will learn about different organisations which help people in different countries who are in challenging situations and how they do this.
