
# An overview of PSHE in Year 2 – Autumn Term 2

Our learning this term in PSHE will be about keeping safe. Children will learn about the different dangers they may come into contact with and will find out more about how they can keep themselves and others safe. We will be using the story 'PenguinPig' when discussing staying safe online.



# Keeping Safe!

Children will find out more about what it means to be safe and will have discussions about safe risk-taking. They will share their ideas about how they already keep themselves safe and the adults they can go to for help if they are unsafe.

# • Staying Safe at Home.

Children will learn more about safety in the home. They will discuss everyday dangers such as boiling water, electrical appliances and fire safety and will find out more about how to prevent accidents from happening.

### Staying Safe Outside.

We will learn more about safety outdoors and will think about what we can do if we find ourselves in danger outside of our homes. ### Staying Safe Online.

Children will discuss the uses of the internet, how it can be fun and also become aware of some dangers that we all need to be aware of. Children will discuss rules to follow for keeping themselves safe when they are online.
