We will continue to learn new spelling rules and develop comprehension skills in reading.

Maths

Addition and subtraction – Children will continue to add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally, including:

- A two-digit number and ones.
- A two-digit number and tens.
- Add three one-digit numbers.



Time – Children will tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on the clock face to show these times. Children will learn the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.

Mass - Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure mass (kg/g) to the nearest appropriate unit using scales

PSHE – Respecting Rights

We will learn about respecting rights this half term. Children will explore the concepts of difference and fairness and encourages them to reflect on how we should behave towards those who are different from us and why it is important to be fair.
