

### Science

**Plants:** Children will observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.

Children will find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

### RE



Children will talk about their own experiences of sad then happy. They will learn about the Easter story and talk about the importance of the feelings of sadness and happiness to Christians when they remember the Easter story.

### English

In English, the children will continue to develop basic fundamental writing skills. They will use the texts, Lila and the Secret of Rain where they will write a letter to a rainbow and Zeraffa Giraffa, using the text to write a diary from the viewpoint of Zeraffa.

### Geography

Children will learn to understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of Zambia and comparing it with Andover/UK.

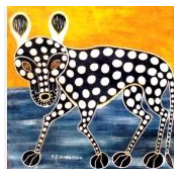
### Maths

Children will continue to extending their counting skills and understanding of number. They will continue to develop fluency of addition and subtraction by adding multiples of 10 and learning about the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction.
